

Lewes Knowledge Test Guidance

Any driver applying to Lewes District Council for a new driver licence must sit and pass a knowledge test, to help demonstrate that they possess a basic understanding of the Highway Code, taxi/private hire legislation, Council guidance and safeguarding and disability awareness. The test may also include questions on knowledge of the local area and numeracy, depending on the type of driver licence being applied for.

A dual driver licence knowledge test includes questions on routes/places of interest, policy and law, Highway Code, road signs, numeracy, safeguarding, and disability awareness.

A restricted private hire knowledge test does NOT include any questions on routes, places of interest or numeracy.

Applicants are limited to three attempts at the test per application and the test must be passed within six months of receipt their application. If they fail the tests, their application will be rejected, and they must wait for at least six months before reapplying.

Any person found cheating will be disqualified from the test and will not be granted a licence for at least three years.

Applicants are required to show their DVLA driving licence on the day of the test, for example a passport, and if they fail to provide this their test will be cancelled. The cost of the first knowledge test is included in the application fee. Each subsequent test is paid for at the time of booking and the fee is non-refundable.

This is a computerised multiple-choice test. Every question will have one correct answer from a choice of four. You will sit on a Teams call with an examiner. You will be able to see all questions and answers on screen and the examiner will read the question and potential answers to you. You will tell the examiner which option you wish to select, and the examiner will click on that answer. The questions are randomly selected for each section of the test.

Please fully read this guide to ensure that you give yourself every opportunity to pass the test. You will be contacted to book your knowledge test after passing your English language test and receipt of your DBS certificate.

The examiner will run through a 'demo' question with you prior to the undertaking of the official knowledge test

The knowledge test is divided into 8 sections, with 60 Questions in total:

*Road Signs and Highway code are classed as 1 section and so the pass mark is 7 marks out of 8 questions (4 Highway code and 4 Road signs)

**Questions on Disability and safeguarding awareness will be related to your Blue Lamp trust training that you have previously undertaken.

Time allowed- 60 minutes

KNOWLEDGE TEST RULES

1. Please ensure that you are prepared to take the test no later than 10 minutes before the scheduled start time. To ensure that your camera, microphone, and computer device are functioning. Please be aware that anyone who is late will not be able to sit the test.
2. You will be required to present your DVLA driving licence to the examiner. Please ensure that you have your DVLA driving licence ready and available to see on request.
3. Prior to the Knowledge test being undertaken you will be required to show the examiner the room and your surroundings to ensure there is no Cheating
4. You are not allowed to leave the room during the test. Leaving the room will terminate the test and the test will be classed as VOID
5. Any person caught or suspected of cheating will be automatically disqualified from the test and this may result in your application being invalidated and returned to you

Knowledge Test – Pass

If you pass the test, then your application will be moved onto the next stage

The questions on subsequent tests will not necessarily be the same as those previously attempted.

Section Details

Section 1- Routes

You will be asked to confirm questions related to routes of travel in the Lewes, Newhaven, Seaford and Peacehaven area. You will be presented with 4 possible answers of which you must choose one. You will be asked to identify the most effective route from one place of interest to another and you will be asked to identify the road names that join main roads & roundabouts in the areas listed above.

Example Question:

In Peacehaven Gladys Avenue runs off

Section 2- Places

You will be asked a series of questions based on places of interest within the Lewes District

You will be asked the road name of which a place of interest is located on. Places of interest include places of worship, licensed venues, industrial estates and popular tourist destinations.

Example Question:

In Lewes which road is Charleston located on?

Section 3- Road Sign

You will be presented with a series of pictures of road signs and asked to identify what it means. There will also be questions on road markings and their meaning. It is strongly recommended that you purchase a current copy of 'The Highway Code' to be able to learn this information. **This information can also be found online [here](#)**

Section 4- Highway Code

You will be presented with a series of questions based on the Highway Code. It is strongly recommended that you purchase a current copy of 'The Highway Code' to be able to learn this information. **This information can also be found online [here](#)**

There will be questions on:

- Speed limits on different types of roads
- Stopping distances
- Seatbelt regulations
- What to do in an emergency
- Tyres and vehicle maintenance

Section 6- Numeracy

You will be asked questions related to counting and basic numeracy

Example Question:

If a customer hands you a £20 note for a journey costing £7.20, how much change would you give them?

Section 7- Conditions

You will be asked multiple questions on Lewes District Council taxi and private hire conditions of licence. These can be found in the [Lewes District Council Taxi and Private Hire Guidance](#):

Example question:

Which one of these is NOT a Condition of Licence?

- 1) The driver must not display any visible body hair while carrying customers**
- 2) The driver shall be clean and tidy in appearance at all times and dressed smartly with long or short sleeved shirt or blouse and long trousers, tailored shorts or skirts. Suitable footwear for driving must be worn.**
- 3) The driver when hired to drive to a particular destination shall proceed to that destination by the shortest available route unless otherwise instructed by the hirer.**
